SECTION 22 DIABETIC FOODS

The following excerpts are from “Diabetes Forecast,” the magazine for the American Diabetes Association.

Entries are limited to one entry per class by exhibitor

Nutrition is the key to good health, especially for people with diabetes. Diabetes is a disease in which the body is unable to use glucose (sugar) in the blood for energy. Instead, glucose stays in the blood and builds up to high levels. Over time, high blood glucose levels may hurt your eyes, kidneys, nerves, and heart. However, a healthy diet can help keep blood glucose levels at more normal levels. The truth is that there is no single “diabetes diet.” What you should eat depends on your health history and needs and, most of all, on the changes in your eating habits you are willing and able to make.

The parameters for exhibiting food at the Bloomsburg Fair for people with diabetes are:

- Be low in fat, especially saturated fat. The recipe should contain very little butter and / or shortening. Acceptable fats include lite butter, olive oil, canola oil, low calorie margarine, and vegetable oil.

- Should contain some fiber. Recipes using oats or whole grain flours are better than recipes using just white flour. Using fruit as part of the recipe is encouraged.
- Moderate amounts of calories. Desserts should be lower in calories than traditional desserts. A calorie range of 100-200 calories per serving is best.
- Moderate amounts of carbohydrates should be used. Recipes can include sugar, but the smaller amount, the better. Artificial sweeteners can be used too. Recipes using sugar free products such as sugar free puddings can be used.

All entries must have recipe recorded on 4" x 6" index card or 8 ½" by 11" paper will become property of the Bloomsburg Fair Association

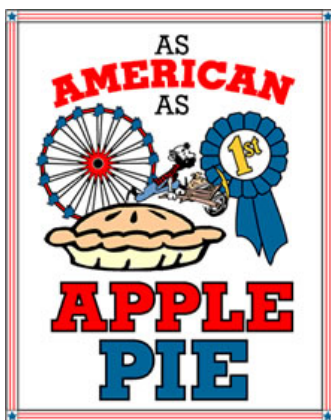

AS AMERICAN AS APPLE PIE

Each county/local fair is encouraged to conduct a 29th Annual Blue Ribbon Apple Pie Contest at their 2019 event. Listed below are the criteria which we would like each fair to use in their contest. The certified first place winner from each fair will then have the opportunity to enter an apple pie in the BLUE RIBBON APPLE PIE CONTEST at the 2020 PENNSYLVANIA FARM SHOW.

RULES for local Fair and the PA Farm Show contests are as follows:

1. Open to any individual who is a Pennsylvania resident: only one entry per person.
2. Entrants may **NOT** have won 1st place in this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest at any other fair in 2019.
3. Entry to be a pie that must include at least 60% apples in the filling. It does not need to be a “traditional” two crusted apple pie and it can have a variety of fillings.
4. The entire pie must be submitted for judging in a disposable pie pan. No glass pie dishes/pans.
5. The recipe for the pie and pie crust must be submitted with the entry. It should be submitted on one side of 8 1/2 “ by 11” paper. The recipe must list all the ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant’s name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages.(All recipes and pies will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will **not** be returned

6. Refrigeration is not available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned, or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reason.
7. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

NOTES:

Creativity is essential to a varied competition. Do not limit your contest to a “traditional” two-crust ed apple pie. We are looking for a variety of fillings in the pies: the pie must include at least 60% apples in the filling.

The recipe for the pie and pie crust will also need to be submitted when entering at the PA Farm Show.

Each fair must sign a Certification Form verifying the winning apple pie baker and this person will be eligible to enter the state competition at the 2020 Farm Show.

NOTE: If an individual has already won 1st place at another fair in 2019 for this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest, that individual is now considered qualified through that Fair to compete at the 2020 PA Farm Show and is no longer eligible to enter this contest at any upcoming Fairs.

2019 PA PREFERRED JUNIOR BAKING CONTEST
COOKIES, BROWNIES AND BARS

RULES:

1. Participant must be an individual amateur baker (age 8 through and including 18 year old) who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. **Entrants may not have won 1st place in the PA Preferred™ Junior Baking Contest at any other fair in 2019.**
3. Entry must be a plate of six (6) individual sized portions of the baked entry item.
4. Entries must be made from scratch. Pre-made mixes are not acceptable ingredients.
5. PA Preferred™ ingredients must be used in the recipe. A comprehensive list of acceptable products will be available on the PA Preferred™ website. Recipes are to include three (3) out of the five (5) items listed here:

a. Grains such as flour or oats	d. Dairy such as milk, cream or butter
b. Fruit such as peaches, apples or berries	e. Eggs
c. Vegetable such as zucchini or carrots	

6. Entry must be submitted for judging on a food safe disposable setting. *(All pans, plates, and dishes are considered disposable and will **not** be returned.)*
7. Recipe(s) must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8-1/2" x 11" paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities and the preparation instructions. Pa Preferred ingredients are to be identified in writing as "PA Preferred" along with the **brand name** in the recipe *(ex: PA Preferred Eggs – Weis brand; PA Preferred Milk – Galliker's brand; PA Preferred Berries – Strite's Orchards)*. Entrant's name, **age**, addresses and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. PA Preferred product labels should be attached to the recipe. *(All recipes and cookies-brownies-bars will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)*

8. Refrigeration is not available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.

PSACF 2019 HOMEMADE CHOCOLATE CAKE CONTEST

RULES:

1. Participant must be an individual amateur baker who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. Entrants may **NOT** have won 1st place in this Homemade Chocolate Cake contest at any other fair in 2019.
3. Entry must be a layered chocolate cake made from “scratch” Pre-made mixes are not acceptable ingredients.
4. Entry must be frosted and frosting must be made from “scratch”.
5. Cake recipe must feature chocolate or cocoa as a main ingredient.
6. The entire cake entry must be submitted for judging on cardboard or other food safe disposable setting. (All pans, plates, and dishes are considered disposable and will **not** be returned.)
7. Recipes must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8-1/2” x 11” paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant’s name, address and phone number must be printed on the **back** side of all the pages, (All recipes and cakes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will **not** be returned.)

SECTION 35 Class 100 ANGEL FOOD CAKE CONTEST RULES



1. Open to any individual who is a Pennsylvania resident.
2. Entrants may **NOT** have won 1st place in this Angel Food Cake contest at any other fair in 2019.
3. Entry must be an Angel Food Cake made from “scratch”
4. **Pennsylvania produced & packed eggs** are requested to be used if at all possible. Please look for the PEQAP or PA Preferred logo or PA packaging dates on the carton.

7. Recipe(s) listing the ingredients and the preparation instructions must be submitted with the entry (*printed on one-side of 8-1/2” X 11” size paper*). Entrant’s name, address and phone # must be printed on the back of the page. (All recipes and cakes will become the property of the Fair PA Farm Show and will **not** be returned.)
8. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

Inside Characteristics (texture & lightness)	25 points
Overall Appearance (surface, size, color)	20 points

Topping, Icing or Decoration	10 points
